Cultus Lake, BC: Cultus Lake Park is a popular destination in the Fraser Valley, welcoming nearly 1.5 million visitors to the lake each year. The Park offers many recreational activities such as swimming, hiking, shopping, dining, fishing, and our great commercial businesses. To ensure you can enjoy the lake with your family and friends, Cultus Lake Park offers five locations for parking.

Cultus Lake Park has recently opened an additional parking lot, located directly behind the Cultus Lake Waterpark. Parking Lot D features one meter and multiple QR codes to easily pay for parking. If visitors are planning a full day at Cultus Lake Park, parking at this lot may be a suitable option as it offers both hourly and day rates. Day rates are Monday through Thursday for \$20.00 and Friday through Sunday for \$25.00.

Our two main parking lots, A and B, have easy access for visitors to enjoy a day at Main Beach. Parking lot A is located off Lakeshore Drive, with a foot bridge over Sweltzer Creek that will take visitors to the beach. This parking lot features three parking meters and QR codes to easily pay for parking. Hourly paid parking is in effect whenever the parking lot is open for visitors. Summer rates are Monday through Thursday for \$4 per hour and Friday through Sunday for \$6 per hour. All transactions will include an additional \$1.00 infrastructure fee.

On Sunnyside Boulevard you will find the newly constructed Parking Lot B, located directly behind Cultus Lake Adventure Park. This lot boasts 346 parking stalls, five parking meters and over twenty QR codes to easily pay for parking. Hourly paid parking is in effect whenever the parking lot is open for visitors.

If a great meal and local treats is what visitors are looking for, parking at the Cultus Lake Park Plaza is available for patrons. Enjoy two hours of free parking by registering the vehicle license plate number into the nearby meter. If visitors are planning to stay for the day, there is day use pay parking available in front of the Dog Park area. Paid parking is in effect when the Park is open; vehicle license plates should be registered, and parking paid for at the meter.

Cultus Lake Park is a self-sustaining entity, receiving no funding from the local or federal government. Visitors to the lake help support funding for necessary service upgrades and maintenance to the Park, for future generations to enjoy.
